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| 1 | Queen Victoria reigned from 1837 until 1901. |
| 2 | To go to school would cost families and children money, meaning many children would be set to work, often in dangerous jobs. |
| 3 | Dr Barnardo and Lord Shaftesbury fought for the rights of children, wanting to see more getting an education. Ragged schools were created. |
| 4 | In 1880, all children were required by law to attend school up until the age of 10. |
| 5 | In 1891, it became free for children to go to school. |
