




Year Four Family Learning Project - Autumn 1

<p>Who were the Shang dynasty and how did they change the world?</p> 	<p>‘The smallest number that rounds to 300 is 301.’ Do you agree? Can you convince me?</p> <p>CHALLENGE! ‘The more digits there are in a number, the greater the value.’ Do you agree?</p>	<p>Write a poem about the Shang dynasty. Use any style of poem that you like. You may wish to illustrate your poem too.</p> <p>CHALLENGE! Does your poem rhyme?</p>	<p>Why do you think dragons are so symbolic in Chinese culture?</p> <p>CHALLENGE! Can you name your dragon?</p>	<p>Create a 3D model of a Chinese lantern.</p>  <p>CHALLENGE! Use junk modelling and art materials, to create a Chinese dragon.</p>	<p>Can you teach someone at home about the achievements of the Shang empire.</p> <p>CHALLENGE! You could speak about art, religion, culture, entertainment and rules of the Shang.</p>	<p>Visit the local lake or river and see whether you can spot any living things and their habitats (in relation to our science topic).</p> <p>CHALLENGE! Classify the insects or animals into groups.</p>	<p>Find out what a riddle is. See if you can write one to share with the class.</p> <p>CHALLENGE! Research</p>  <p>Chinese calligraphy and have a go at writing your name.</p>	<p>Watch Disney’s Mulan. A well-known ancient folktale in Chinese history. This will give context to our topic ‘the Shang dynasty’- focusing on how some civilisations lived historically.</p>
